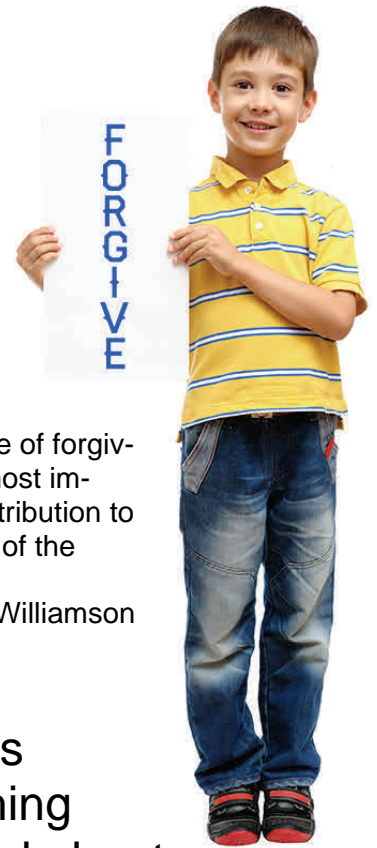

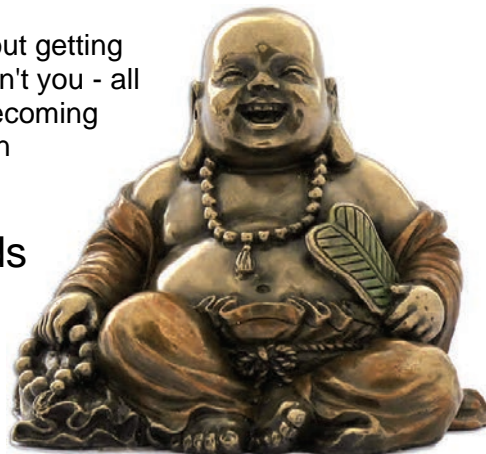

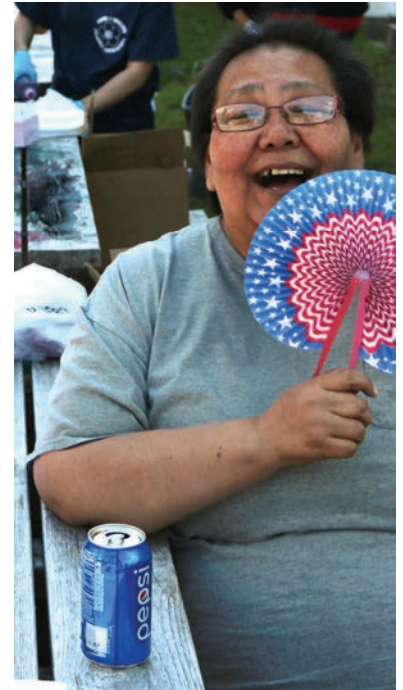
Port Graham Tribal Members 'Celebrated Life' on the Third and Fourth of July again this year at the Center.

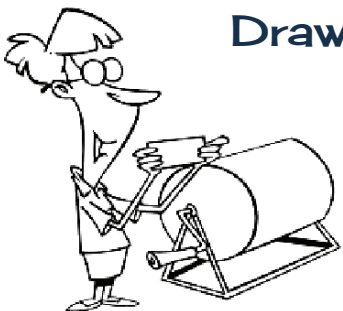
